Crime

Updates

Leicestershire Police have launched a project which aims to educate professionals (health, teachers, social workers, and others) who work with children, young people, and vulnerable adults at risk of County Lines so that they can spot the signs and report their suspicions. This follows on from the successful enforcement work already undertaken in the past four weeks as part of Operation Lionheart which has seen dozens of arrests take place.

A new pilot project has been designed to help repeat victims of crime. It aims to provide an incremental response to repeat victims of crime and improve the quality of service that we will deliver.

A well sought criminal has been arrested and remains in custody, who was causing harm to our community.

Anti-social Behaviour

Dealing with youths who have been driving Motorbikes in an anti-social manner remains our priority. We are also working in partnership with our neighbouring beats who face similar problems.

People often ask 'why can't you just catch them?' Officers have to give serious consideration to the risks involved to those involved who more often than not do not wear helmets. If it is deemed too high risk for the rider, the officers and the general public it may not be authorised. If a motorbike was being used during a serious crime in progress, officers would seek guidance from senior officers as to whether to pursue, based on the level of serious crime that the rider is involved in. Children and young person's riding about in an anti-social way may be annoying and could cause an accident but that has to be outweighed with the very high risk to their life if they are pursued and also the serious possibility of the officer involved facing a criminal charge of dangerous driving simply because of the biker's driving (not the officer's). We are trying more conventional ways to identify those involved including CCTV, public appeals for information of the ID's, the possible use of drone's, and other tactics that can be considered.

We have had some success recently and several bikes have been seized that were being ridden about anti-socially. If anyone has further information about such behaviour, please contact us.
